The death registration is for the March quarter. I am not sure if you have ever applied for a copy birth/marriage/death certificate, but just in case you can do this online via:

Registration began 1837 though some births are not there as it was voluntary for a while. Mu apologies if you already have this information.

You are lucky to have the family bible. They did seem to be a mobile family. Probably a lot of work needs to be done looking at the parish registers, held on microfilm, at the Derbyshire Record Office, Matlock.

When the official marriage registrations began in 1837 the names of the bride and groom's parents were recorded for the first time. Before that date the only extra information you would gain by seeing the full entry in the parish register would be the names of the witnesses. So, the marriage is not going to help you.

I had a look at the baptism details in Findmypast. The two people from Derbyshire Family History that are attributed to the record are very accurate with transcriptions.

I had a look at newspaper articles on FMP and there did seem to be a Lord Hill in the army in Leicester.

The only other thing I can think of is a Will, but not many people actually made Wills.

I live at nearby Repton but I cannot find anything in the History Group archives that would help you. It is frustrating, but mostly an illegitimate birth provides an insurmountable brick wall. I have come across it myself and have diverted my research to other lines.
