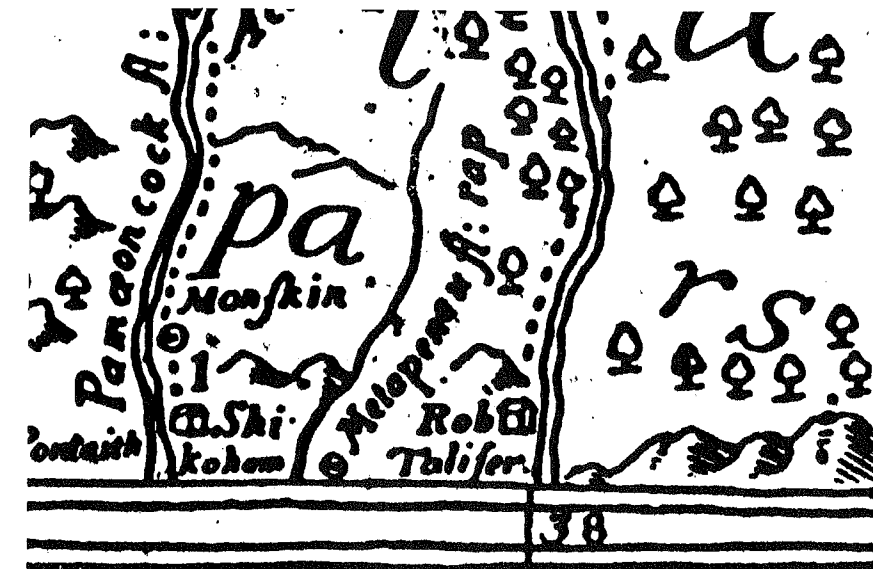

TALIAFERRO'S MOUNT," Old Rappahannock (later Essex, now Caroline) Co, VA in 1670

The 334 acre *Taliaferro's Mount*, purchased by Robert Taliaferro the Colonist in 1666, remained in the family for almost 175 years. The stylized sketch on John Lederer's 1670 map of the Rappahannock River shows the home of one 'Rob Talifer.' It most likely was the typical 'pole house' surrounded by a circular, protective palisade. The previous owner's brother (Mr. White) & 7 others were killed in a 1661 attack; their 8 coffins were found adjacent to the brick half-basement of the pre-1737 house in 2011. *The Mount* passed to Robert's son, Francis; his estate inventory in 1710 shows that the original house had been replaced by a dwelling with a hall, three rooms & separate kitchen. *The Mount* was inherited by Francis' son John in 1710. This original home was destroyed by fire; it was replaced in 1737 with a new 14' x 24' home with cellar, two 8' porticoes, two large sheds & separate kitchen; it is this home which is believed to have formed the core of the present manor house now called *Haymount* (likely named for Agatha (Hay) Taliaferro). In 1763, the home passed to John's eldest son Francis who in turn, willed the home to his nephew Francis (w1773) in 1768. The home was sold upon the death of Charles Champ Taliaferro, son of Francis (w1773), when he died in 1832. The family graveyard—a large site without stone—is now covered by periwinkle; it is located downslope towards the River and contains the graves of six generations of Taliaferros. As the graves of the Taliaferro owners of nearby *Cedar Creek* has not been found, it is also possible that these two are to be found at *The Mount* (WPA: VA Hist. Inv. #151 "The Mount," 1937).

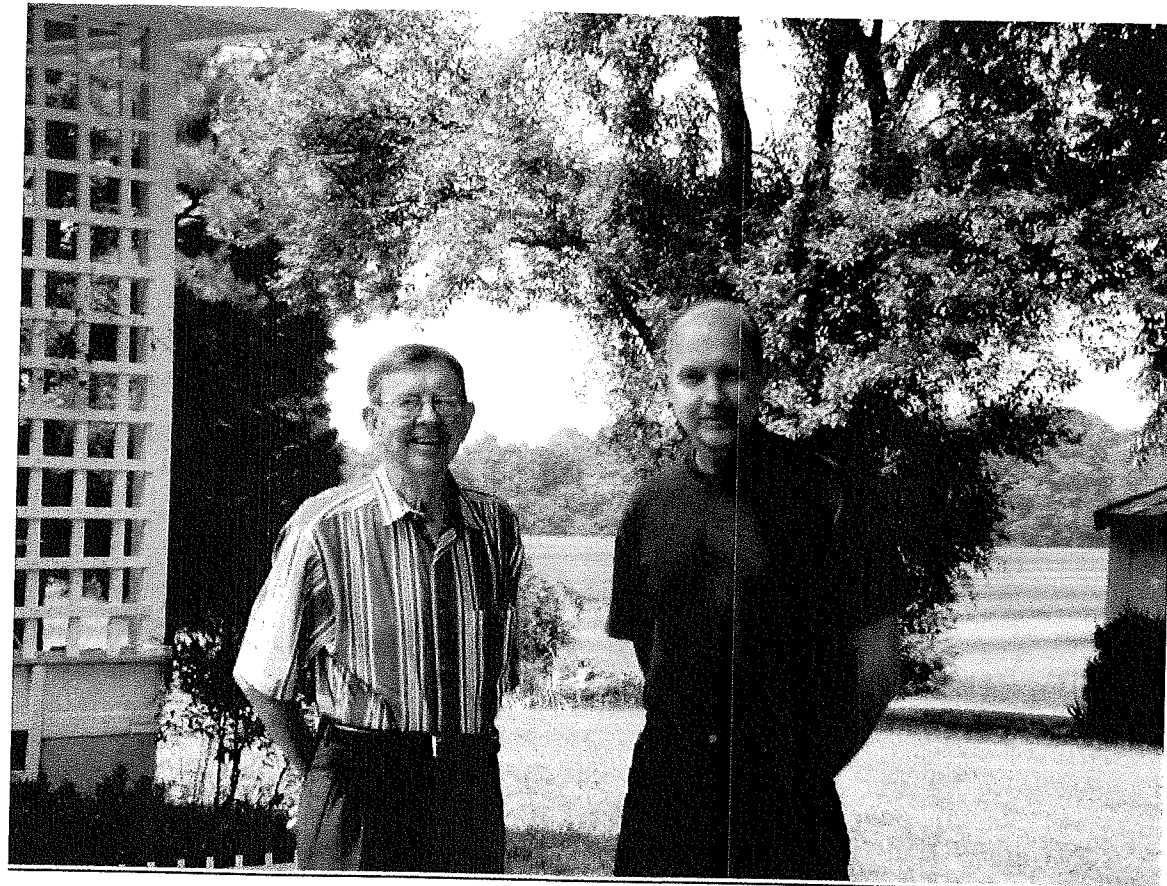

A Dedication to Beverly C. Pratt (1914-2005)

A Virginia institution, Beverly C. Pratt was an expert on the families and history of Caroline County, Virginia. Bev lived with his wife on their ancestral farm, *Cedar Creek*, near Port Royal, VA. On this farm is found John Taliaferro The Ranger's famous "Brick House" (circa 1696) – now Cedar Creek – the first brick structure in the wilderness of Virginia. The site was "dug" by a team assembled by Bev in the summers of 1990 and 1991. This was reported by Bev and myself in an article in Virginia Davis' *Tidewater Virginia Families Magazine* (republished herein).

Bev was a major source of the information on the famous Caroline Taliaferros – the Virginia county that today houses both *Taliaferro's Mount* aka *The Mount/Haymount* and the "Brick House," now *Cedar Creek*. The Taliaferros dominated the history of that county in the eighteenth century. Our tours of *Cedar Creek*, *The Mount/Haymount*, and *Camden* (a Pratt home where Bev and his wife are now buried) is a memory I shall always treasure.

I miss him, and I regret he did not live to see the Taliaferro Index reach publication.

PREFACE

The TALIAFERRO INDEX is a comprehensive presentation of the family to circa 1825--tracing all lines for 8 generations (Bartholomew to his gr.gr.gr.gr.grandchildren).

Many Tidewater Virginia county records have been lost and/or destroyed. Moreover, the descendants of Robert & Katherine (Debnam) Taliaferro often replicated given names. There are also numerous intermarriages of Taliaferro cousins. These factors account for much of the confusion and errors in family history on this family which have been published to date.

Due to new findings by Taliaferro researchers (Marg't R. Amundsen, C.G., Henry Taliaferro, & W.W. Rogers), this compilation has factored out many of these errors & myths. Thus, it is hoped by the compiler that this INDEX will provide an accurate starting point for both the layperson and professional alike so the Reader will, as Eco says, "complete the text".

A MASTER CHART (pgs. 8-9) of the male descendants of Robert & Katherine (Debnam) Taliaferro is presented through the fifth generation in America. The pages following contain FAMILY GROUP SHEETS (FGS) for each male of the name having issue filed by given name. Each sheet contains a source document reference to the Bibliography.

Following the FGS are APPENDICES tracing allied families, intermarriages, Bibles, census, public life, lands, migrations, slaves, tax lists, war service and wills:

The TALIAFERRO INDEX reports new conclusions, primarily pertaining particularly to the burned record counties of Caroline and King & Queen Co, VA. Much D.A.R. Taliaferro data is in error. In the few cases where it has been utilized in this INDEX, its accuracy is often unverified by primary source evidence and hence, should be used with caution.

Taliaferro is a prominent name in the history of Virginia and in the United States (to wit: Former Speaker Samuel Taliaferro Rayburn and Booker T(aliaferro) Washington).

Taliaferro research stands on the shoulders of some of Virginia's greatest genealogists as the Bibliography attests. While many of these now historic researchers have passed, some of Virginia's greatest Taliaferro researchers are still at work: **Margaret R. Amundson, CG**, **W. Wayne Rogers** and **Henry G. Taliaferro, Esq.**

Given the fact that Taliaferros played such an important role in Caroline Co, VA, Taliaferro researchers also owe a debt of special thanks to Caroline specialists such as TE. Campbell & his niece, Kimberly Curtis Campbell (spouse of the current Caroline Clerk, Ray Smith Campbell Jr), Emma May Campbell, Wm. Lindsay Hopkins, and finally, Herbert Ridgeway Collins: clearly people who inspire those of us who follow...

I would like to dedicate this work to the memory of my mentors who assisted me in the compilation of this work: **Wm Anderson Hagey** (d.1999) of Roanoke VA, **Geo. Taliaferro Stribling** (d.2007) of Aiken, GA, and finally, **Beverley Crump Pratt** (d.2005) of 'Cedar Creek Farm', Port Royal, VA--site of John Taliaferro's 'Brick House'--for their invaluable help.

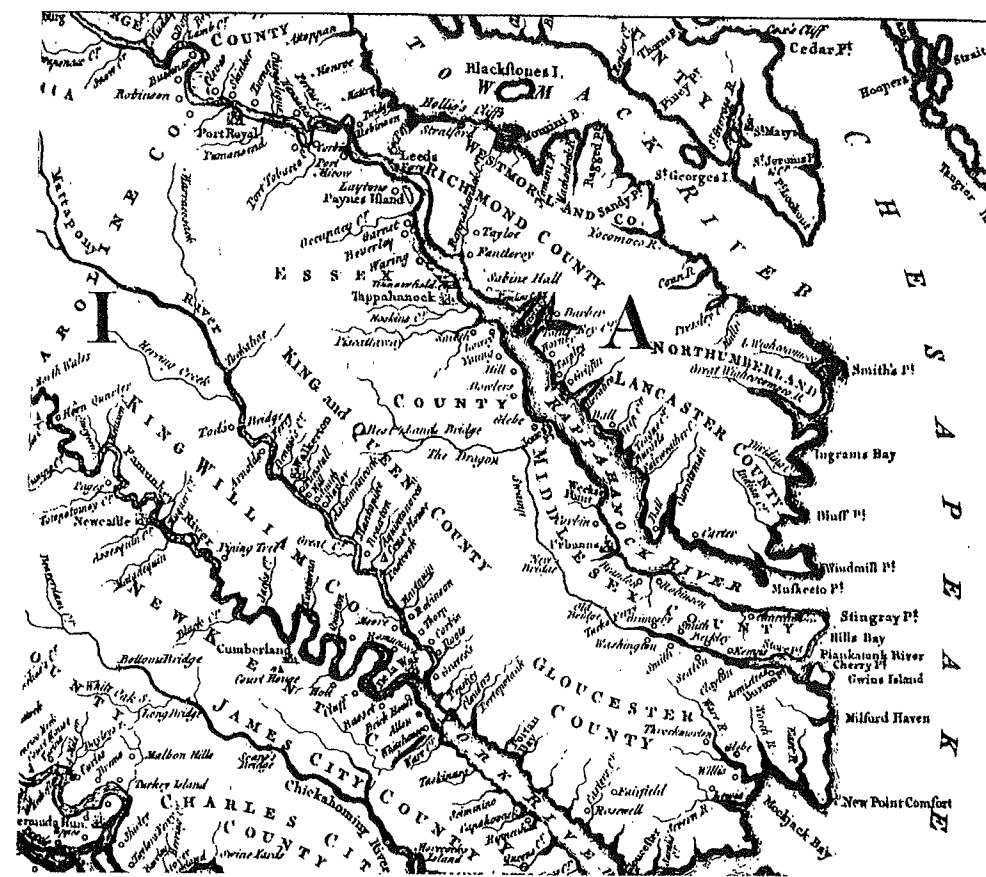

TALIAFERRO COUNTY EVOLUTIONS & SPLITS

Taliaferros lived in places where county splits occurred, particularly in the first three generations. A summary for quick reference is provided below:

- Henrico County, original shire, formed 1634:
 - Goochland formed from Henrico in 1727:
 - Albemarle formed from Goochland (and Louisa) in 1744:
 - Amherst formed from Albemarle in 1761
 - Fluvanna formed from Albemarle in 1777
- Charles River County, original shire, formed 1634 (changed to York County in 1643):
 - New Kent formed from York (and James City) in 1654:
 - King & Queen formed from New Kent in 1691:
 - King William formed from King & Queen in 1701/2
- Gloucester formed from York in 1651
- Lancaster formed from York & Northumberland Counties in 1652:
 - Old Rappahannock (1656-1692) formed from Lancaster in 1656:
 - Essex & Richmond formed from Old Rapp'k in 1692:
 - King George formed from Richmond & West'd in 1721
 - Spotsylvania formed from Essex in 1720:
 - Orange formed from Spotsylvania in 1734
 - Culpeper formed from Orange in 1746
 - Caroline formed from Essex in 1728

Taliaferros in 17th & 18th Century Tidewater Virginia

Three boatloads of English Colonists arrived on the northeast shore of the James River in May, 1607 and founded Jamestown. By the winter of 1609, the colony consisted of 490 persons; by the next spring, only 60 persons survived. New Colonists arrived, however, and the colony grew; by 1700, it consisted of 80,000 persons—including the children and grandchildren of Robert and Katherine (Debnam) Taliaferro.

The original settlers were from midland and southern England: in Virginia, they settled in the tidewater coastal plain (Taliaferros primarily lived in Middle Neck counties, depicted above). Smaller landholders moved westward to the Piedmont where they were joined by a new wave of English and Scottish immigrants. West Africans, first imported to Virginia in 1619, were brought in large numbers starting about 1680.

In the early 1700s, French Huguenots arrived, followed by German workers imported (in 1714-17) to work iron furnaces in the Piedmont area. During the 1730s and 1740s, large numbers of settlers of Ulster Scot and German descent moved southward from Pennsylvania down the Allegheny Ridges into the Shenandoah Valley. By the late 18th century, Virginia lost many residents as families moved west to new territories and because there was very little foreign immigration to Virginia after 1800.

It was in this setting that the men and women traced in the Taliaferro Index lived...

THE TALIAFERRO NAME

The name TALIAFERRO (pronounced 'Toliver') is of a Venitian origin (Italy did not become a county until the late 1800's). It is not a English or Norman-French family name. These facts were discovered by the great British genealogist, Sir Anthony Wagner, Garter King of Arms & his assistant, Mr.F.S.Andrus. Their research, tracing the Taliaferro migration from Venice to London, England before 1562, was published in 1969 in the Virginia Magazine of History & Biography, Vol.77, p.22 (5.VM(r).373 in the GPC reprint).

The name TALIAFERRO means 'ironworker.' When he was in France, Thomas Jefferson was asked by his friend & mentor, George Wythe (1725-87)--lawyer, teacher, Patriot, burgess, Signer of the Declaration of Independence --to search for Taliaferro origins in Italy (see Appendix: Taliaferros in History). Wythe had married Elizabeth Taliaferro (1739-1787), d/o the famous architect, Richard (Francis-Robert) of James City Co, VA. Professor Bellini at William & Mary College had told Wythe that he knew of Taliaferros in Tuscany. The family tradition that the name came from a coat of arms awarded to a Norman Knight for valor and that the inscription meant 'deeds of iron' proved untrue, however.

American Taliaferros descend from Robert Taliaferro (1626-c1671) who came to VA a1647. Robert was the only known surviving male Taliaferro descendant of his Venetian grandfather, Bartholomew Taliaferro who came to England a1562. Bartholomew was likely a trader in the Venice to London trade which thrived during the reign of Elizabeth 1.

While the spelling of the name varies, most Taliaferros kept the original spelling. Early variations are found in the land patents (see Nugent, N: Taliafer, Taliafero, Taliaferoe, Talifro, Talliafero, Talliaferro, Tallifer, Talliferoe, Troliver & Tolliver; see also Reamy, M&W: 'Union List': Talifero & Tallifaro; and finally, see Hewlett JB: Roster of Confederate Soldiers, 1861-1865: Talifaro, Tallifaro, Taleferro, Talenferro, Taliferro & Talioferro.

The descendants of Robert & Katherine (Debnam) Taliaferro often replicated given names. This has led to much confusion, especially in the burned record counties where Taliaferros proliferated (ie.Caroline). This accounts for much of the confusion and the many errors which have been published to date.

A Planter & Architect, Richard Taliaferro was noted for his design of the Wythe House (a gift to his daughter) and many other famous Virginia homes.

Elizabeth Taliaferro (1739-1787) = George Wythe, Signer (1725-1806)

A distinguished lawyer & teacher, George Wythe was a Patriot, Burgess, member of the Continental Congress & a Signer of the Declaration of Independence. In 1762, George Wythe accepted, as a law student at Wm & Mary, Thomas Jefferson, then nineteen. For the next five years, Jefferson was a frequent visitor at the home of George & Elizabeth (Taliaferro) Wythe.

Jefferson said in his AUTOBIOGRAPHY (1821): "Mr.Wythe continued to be my faithful and beloved mentor of my youth, and my most affectionate friend through life."

When Jefferson was representing the United States in Paris (1785-9), Wythe wrote requesting Jefferson to search for Taliaferro origins in Italy, which (from a professor of foreign languages at Wm & Mary), Wythe believed might have come from Tuscany. Jefferson, through inquiries in Florence, was able to send Wythe a copy of the arms of an unrelated Tagliaferri family (3.WM(r).754 & 4.WM(r).720). See attachments to follow.

WYTHE-JEFFERSON CORRESPONDENCE RE: TALIAFERRO

The following is the correspondence (now at the Library of Congress) between George Wythe (GW) & Thomas Jefferson (TJ) on the origin of the Taliaferro family. Mr.Wythe's interest was due to the fact that his second wife was Elizabeth Taliaferro, d/o Col.Richard & Elizabeth (Eggleston) Taliaferro of James City Co, VA. To be noticed is the chirography of the two: full of reform spirit, Mr.Jefferson used capitals only to mark a paragraph or a proper name, while Mr.Wythe discarded the capital for the first person and used a small letter.

GW to TJ

I wish to get the arms of Taliaferro, which, from information, i believe to have been a tuscan family, engraven on a copper-plate, with this motto OT ΔΟΚΕΙΝ ΑΡΙΣΤΟΣ ΑΛΛ' ΕΙΝΑΙ, and the name Richard Taliaferro. But i would not have this done, if it can not be without giving you trouble, nor unless you will order to whom here i shall repay the cost. Perhaps the motto, taken from Aeschylus (ΕΠΠΑ ΕΠΙ Θηδασ, Six 598) would be sufficient without ΑΡΙΣΤΟΣ. If you think so, leave out that word. Adieu. 10 jan.1786. Wmsbrg.

GW to TJ

In a letter, written lately to you, after acknowledging the receipt of a pacquet, i begged you, if it would not be inconvenient, to procure for me the arms of Taliaferro, engraven on a small copper plate, with the name Richard Taliaferro, and this motto, taken from ΕΠΠΑ ΕΠΙ Θηδασ Αισχυλου 6.598. ΟΥ ΘΟΜΕΙΥ ΑΡΙΣΤΟΣ ΑΛΛ' ΕΙΥΑ, or without ΑΡΙΣΤΟΣ, if you think it, omitted, will be understood. In this i desire your assistance, because i believe the family to have been tuscan, Mr.Bellini [Professor of Modern Languages at W&M] having infomed me that a district not further distant from Florence than 12 or 13 miles bears that name. Farewell. Williamsburg, 10 februa.1786.

TJ to GW

Immediately on the receipt of your letter I wrote to a correspondent at Florence to enquire after the family of Taliaferro as you desired. I received his answer two days ago, a copy of which I now enclose...I will have the copper plate immediately engraved. This may be ready within a few days, but the probability is that I shall be long getting an opportunity of sending it to you, as these rarely occur. You do not mention the size of the plate, but presuming it is intended for the labels for the inside of books, I shall have it made of the proper size for that. I shall omit the word ΑΡΙΣΤΟΣ according to the license you allow me, because I think the beauty of a motto is, to condense which matter in as few words as possible, the word omitted will be supplied by every reader...Paris, Aug.13, 1786.

GW to TJ

By the letter, which i lately received from you, i find myself indebted further for that kind attention to me, to prove which you never suffer an opportunity to pass unheeded. I am endeavouring to satisfy the inquiry of the Taliaferri, near Florence, about their emigrant kinsman, according to mr.Fabbroni's desire. at present i incline to think that this person was he who Buchanan, rerum scoticarum lib. xiii.c.41, mentions, calling him Lautentium Taliaferreo, virum probum et doctum, et pueris regiis; and that one of his posterity, rather than himself, was founder of the virginian family, for the year 1500, or between it & 1515 was the time when this Laurence was in Scotland....Adieu. Williamsburgh, 13 decemb.1788.

TJ to GW

I am now to acknowledge the receipt of your favours of Dec the 13th and 22d 1786 and of Jan. 1787...I sent you formerly the documents on the Tagliaferro family which I have received from Mr. Febroni. I now send the originals...Paris, Sept 16, 1787.

Letter to Mr. Jefferson, in French

Sir: Before replying to your obliging letter I wished to put myself in a position to answer the question with which you have honored me. I have found two families of Tagliaferri, one living at Manadi and the other at Lozzole, in a part of Tuscany that is called Mugello, and both recognize the same place of origin which is believed to be a part of Tagliaferri Village, which bears their name. I have seen the two heads of these two families. One is called Francesco di Guiseppe Tagliaferri; he is the one of Manadi; the other is older and is called Giovanna Tagliaferri. They are honest country people, and the first appeared to be more at ease. They told me they have preserved the tradition that in the year of the memorable famine there was one of their family who went away from their house, but they did not know where; there was a great famine in Tuscany in 1709, or in the past century. I asked them if it was not at that time the emigration took place; they answered they did not know. They have in their homes their coat of arms and I send you a sketch of it. These good people would be happy to have some information about the family transplanted to America which has had these inquiries made. If you have any that would satisfy them you would greatly oblige me....Jean Fabbroni. Florence, 20 July, 1789.

P.S. These Taliaferri admitted to me that they are not well off, although they have some little land, and they follow the straw hat trade (Memorandum Enclosed; Original in Italian).

The House of Tagliaferri in Tuscany

This family lives at Manadi in the Commune of Cardeto. Another family in Commune of Lozzole, Magistracy of the Palezzolo of Romange. Another, third family lives in the parish of Casaglia Magistracy of the suburb of San Lorenzo.

At Manadi there is now four brothers, sons of the late Guiseppe Tagliaferri.

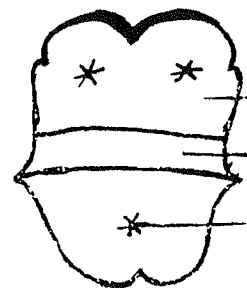
At Lozzolo lives Giovanni, of the late Sambì, who has six daughters and an only son.

At Casaglia live four brothers, sons of the late Francesco Tagliaferro. Two of the aforesaid have a wife and family, the other two are priests.

All these families own and cultivate their own lands. By tradition they have it that they originated at Mugello, where there is a place called Tagliaferro, and it is not long since they have sold their lands there.

They say also from tradition that they have always heard it said that one of them went away to far countries; they do not know his name, but believe it may be the one who left their on account of the great famine in the last century.

The Tagliaferri family of Cardeto possesses a document from which it appears that at the end of the year 1599 Pietro Menghini of the Tagliaferri founded a chapel in the parochial church of San Patrizio in Tirli, Florentine Diocese, Vicarage of Firenzuola.

MONROE-TALIAFERRO: 5th & 6th Generation John Taliaferros

In 1820, then-President James Monroe signed a promisory note to "John Taliaferro" for almost \$10,000, payable in two months upon the sale of property owned by Monroe.

The note was co-signed by George Hay (the Hay family being intermarried with the Taliaferros of Caroline Co, VA).

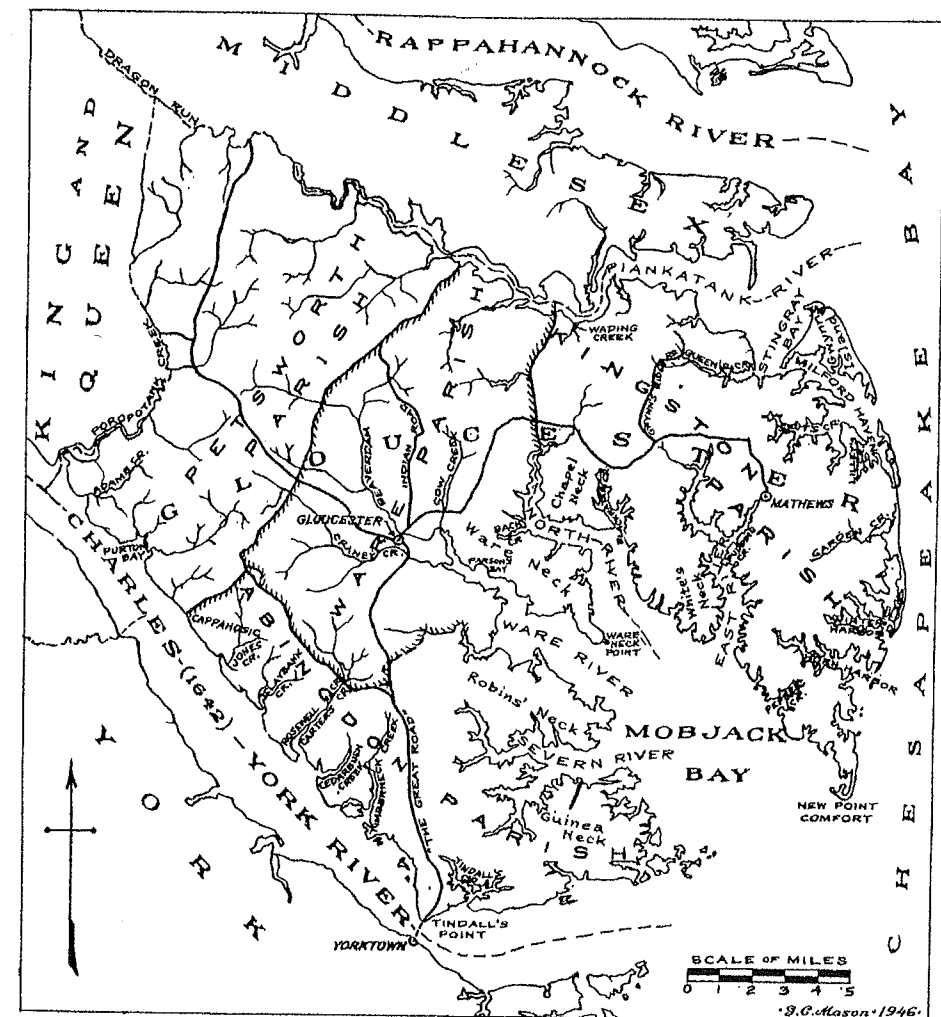

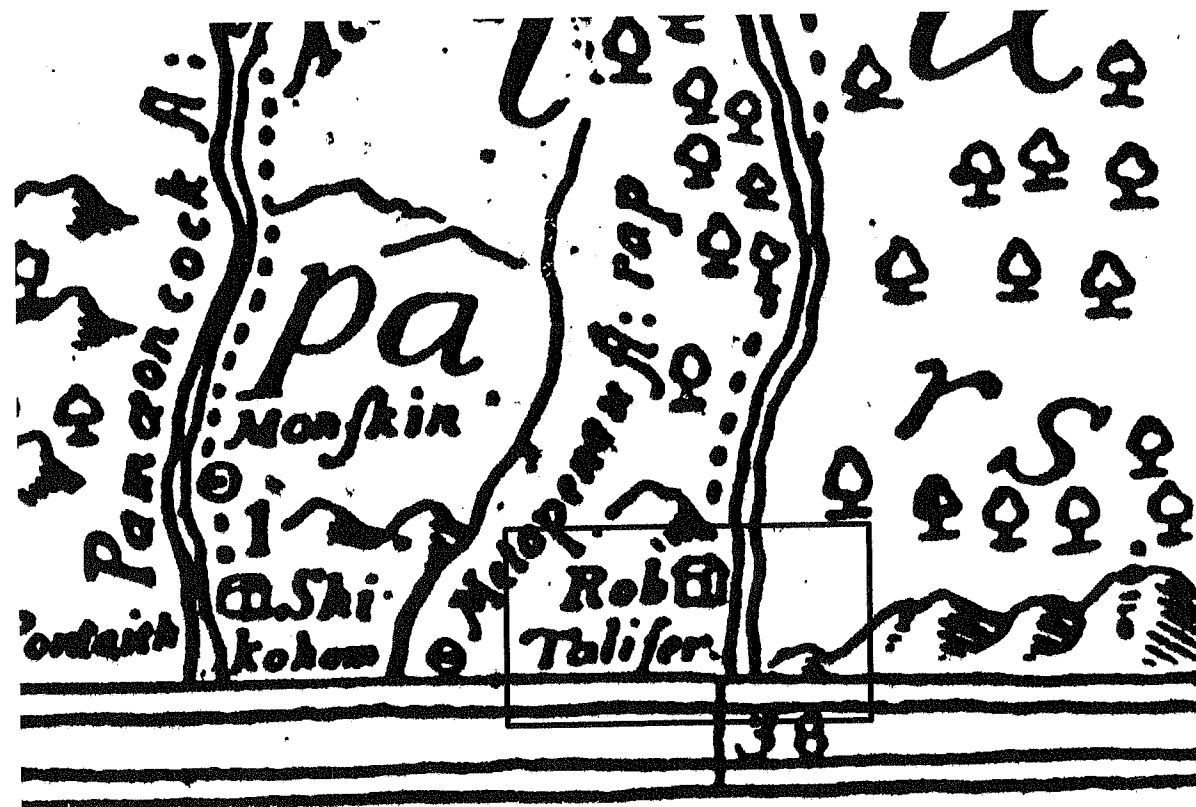
Gloucester County, Virginia

01.12.1651: Robert Taliaferro, with Samuel Sallis Sr. (died 1661), was granted 800 acres in Petsworth Parish on the southeast side of Poropotank Creek and bounded on the northeast by Attopotomayes Creek. When renewed in 1655, the patent was increased by 100 acres for transport of two persons. Robert's son, Francis Sr., was in possession of this land in 1682 when it was described as on the northeast side of Purton Path. The location today is unknown. (Mason, p. 65)

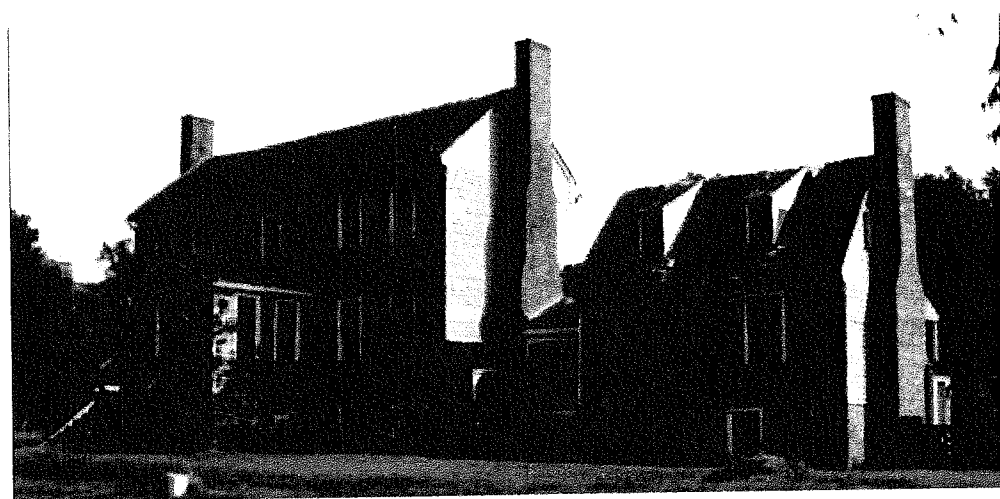
Ante 04.10.1667: Robert granted a "Quarter" (plantation without a residence) in Ware Parish.

RECORDS OF COLONIAL GLOUCESTER COUNTY, VIRGINIA, by Mason (1946) provides a summary of Virginia Land Office patents and of deeds of other Virginia counties which substitute for the Gloucester records destroyed in fires in 1821 and 1865. Loss of such records makes the disposition of these early Taliaferro lands unclear. These properties do not appear to have any connection with subsequent Taliaferros of Gloucester County, Virginia.

OLD RAPPAHANNOCK (then Essex, now Caroline) COUNTY, VA

MASSAPONAX/SNOW CREEK: On March 26, 1666, Robt Taliaferro & his brother-in-law, Lawrence Smith, were granted (by Gov. Berkeley) 6300 acres on the southside of the Rapp'k River between Snow Creek & Massaponax Creek for transportation of 126 persons (VA Plat Book 5 p.481). The site lies in present Spotsylvania County NW of its boundary with Caroline County. When patented it was one of the uppermost patents on the Rapp'k River beyond the protection of the VA Rangers & was unoccupied until the 3rd generation.

Massaponax/Snow Creek was divided by the partners on 05.16.1667, Robt Taliaferro choosing the downstream moiety bordered by Snow Creek. In 1682, Francis Taliaferro Sr, 'sonne & heir' of his deceased father, gifted 2000 acres to his bro. John Sr & 1600 acres jointly to his brothers Richard & Charles (Old Rapp'k DB 7 p.7). None of the three lived there: Richard & Charles sold their 1600 acres to Wm Woodford. John bequeathed his 2000 acres to his son, John Taliaferro Jr, later of *Snow Creek*.

TALIAFERRO'S MOUNT: On September 5, 1666, Robert Taliaferro 'of Gloucester County' purchased 1300 acres in two parcels from Richard White and his wife Adria (Old Rapp'k DB 3 p.79 & 83). The easternmost 500a parcel lay along the Rapp'k, about 4 miles downstream from Snow Creek & was bounded on the north by land of Rev. Chas Grymes on the NW by woods & southwest by Abraham Moone (later by Christopher Robinson).

In 1667, when registering patents on wooded lands to the NW, Henry Corbyn had his land surveyed, revealing an overlap w/500 acres of Robt Taliaferro's prior purchase. This was quickly settled, Henry ceding to Robert 334 of the 500 acres, including all houses (DB 3 p.303). Robert Taliaferro promptly moved onto his land & was appt'd Old Rapp'k Co, VA Justice 10.04.1667 (38.VG(o).168). These 334 acres, rising sharply from the Rapp'k River, was called *Taliaferro's Mount* or *The Mount*. For 50 yrs this was a major outpost on the River.

--In 1661, it had been the scene of a particularly brutal attack by Indians in which Richard White's brother was killed & 7 others mutilated/scalped (DB 2 p.201);

--On 08.20.1670 when the German Explorer John Lederer set out on his last (of 3) expeditions from 'the house of Rob Talifer,' it was clearly the uppermost dwelling on the River (see *The Discoveries of Lederer p.34*);

--Both Robert Beverley's *History & Present State of VA* (1705) & John Fontaine's *Journal* (1715) mention *Taliaferro's Mount* for its view of the River and mountains.

The 334 acre *Taliaferro's Mount* (est.1666) remained in the family for 175 years being sold out of the family in 1832. The tombstone of the last Taliaferro owner, Charles Champ Taliaferro--the only extant stone--was reported as being used as a step to the back porch of *Haymount*, the manor home built by grandson John of *The Mount* after the original home of Robert & his son Francis was lost due to fire in 1737. *The Mount* is the gravesite of those killed in the 1661 raid, six generations of Taliaferros, and members of the Gouldin family:

A VA State Historical Marker on US Route 17, four mi SE of the Spots-Caroline boundary, notes that the Lederer Expedition (1670) started 'near here.' The site of *Taliaferro's Mount* may be reached by going SE one mile on US Route 17, then turning NE on Route 615; after 0.7 miles on Route 615, turning right on Route 614; thence 0.4 miles on Route 614, and an additional 5.1 miles SE and South on private roads.

John² Taliaferro's 'Brick House' est.1696), now called *Cedar Creek* (Item #7), where he probably died in 1720. This 'Platt' was in John's² will survey; it is found among the Minor [Family] papers at the VA Hist. Society. The 'Brick House' & 300 acres passed to son Wm³; the other half of the 600 acre parcel went to son Rich'd³ [John² had previously deeded to Lawrence³ 300 acres adjoining in 1715]. Lawrence³ seems to have purchased the 'Brick House' site of 300 acres in 1723-6 from bro.Wm³ who removed to K&QCo. Lawrence³ left the 'Brick House' to his son Wm⁴ in his will (1726) as well as the 300 acres where he resided.

Bro.Francis⁴ as Wm's⁴ 'heir apparent' took possession ante 1757 & Francis⁴ in turn left his Caroline lands (including 'Brick House') to his son Lawrence⁵ in 1758 who advertised (*VA Gazette* 08.15.1766) the sale of the 712 acres which belonged to his father Francis⁴, grfather Law³ & included the 300 acre site of the 'Brick House' of great-grandfather John² Taliaferro. The house described in the ad, however, was not the 'Brick House' which by then was likely in disrepair/dismantled. The home described in 1766 advertisement was likely 'Waverly', the home of Lawrence³--modeled after the 'Brick House' & built 1715-1726.

"Brick House," Rappahannock at Peumansend (now Mill) Creek, Essex (now Caroline) County, Virginia.

The excavation of the "Brick House" of John Taliaferro was conducted by Stephen Harriman, a descendant of John, in 1990-1. Per *The Caroline Progress*, Caroline County, Virginia, 13 May 1992.

Port Royal --- Archeologists, architectural historians and preservationists from some of Virginia's most prominent historic sites joined forces March 27-28 to complete evacuation of the John Taliaferro site at Cedar Creek Farm near Port Royal. The colonial plantation site, on land now owned by Doris (Mrs. Beverley) Powers Pratt [died in 1999] and son, Wm Beverley Pratt of Greensboro, North Carolina, was part of 600 acres on the Rappahannock River overlooking the mouth of Peumansend Creek purchased in 1696 [1695, 1698] by John Taliaferro.

There is archaeological evidence that the house was built about 1696, probably of bricks fired on the site. The fifty-five foot by twenty-three foot structure with a partial cellar was occupied by the Taliaferro family until at least 1735. At some subsequent time later in the eighteenth-century it appears to have fallen into disrepair and was eventually dismantled and its bricks used elsewhere.

The plantation included at least three dependencies in addition to the mansion house as well as a mill located near where U.S. Route 17 crosses Peumansend Creek. The foundation and cellar layout of the mansion house were of particular interest to the experts because they represent a rare bridge between vernacular dwellings of the early colonial period and the more formal Georgian structures of the eighteenth-century colonial design. The mansion house had large chimneys at its north and south ends, but they were offset at opposite sides from the center roof line.

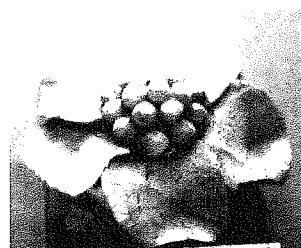
The most significant archaeological artifacts were a collection of ornamental oyster shell, molded plaster in the shape of a five-petaled flower and backed by lanceolated leaves [see photo]. - Some were found in near-perfect condition, others fragmented. This type of decorative work is a mark of a high degree of sophistication and taste at the very edge of the frontier.

These flowers and leaves are so nearly identical to artifacts found at the Governor's House at Jamestown as to appear to have been made by the same artisan. The Jamestown artifacts were originally dated in the 1650-1675 range, an estimate that is now being re-examined. There are no other known samples of such artifacts and their location, more than 100 miles apart - a great distance in colonial times - is difficult to explain.

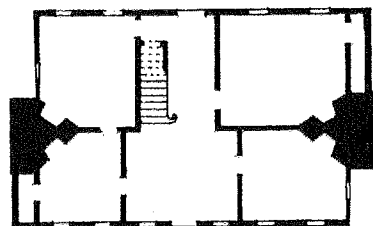
There is speculation that John Taliaferro, during his brief services at Jamestown in the House of Burgesses may have seen the decorations, found the artisan and hired him to decorate his newly built house. Taliaferro may have made earlier journeys to Jamestown, since he seems to have had more than a passing acquaintance with Nicholson, the soldier-governor.

The heavy artifact density spread over more than two acres by several centuries of cultivation are helpful in understanding the everyday life on a frontier plantation complex in the late seventeenth and early eighteenth centuries. They include more than 1,600 clay tobacco pipe-stem and pipe-bowl fragments, pottery sherds [shards] ranging in quantity from the most utilitarian Colono-Indian and lead glazed earthenware to elegant pieces of Chinese porcelain spoons, household cooking implements, clothing buckles and farm hardware such as stirrups and bridal pieces.

Faunal remains, indicating a part of the family and slave diet, include cow, pig, deer, sheep or goat, raccoon, turtle and bird bones, as well as, numerous large oyster shells.

Legacy of John Taliaferro "The Ranger"

The *Brick House* was the probable site of the death and burial of John Taliaferro, probably in early 1720, and that of his wife Sarah Smith⁹ who died after 1715--although no gravesites have been located on the premises.¹⁰ John Taliaferro wrote his will on June 1, 1715, naming his wife and children and stating that he was living on his land on Peumansend Creek in Essex County. His will was probated June 21, 1720 Essex Co, VA.¹¹

He gave his sons Lawrence (married Sarah Thornton) and John (married Mary Catlett) the homes they now live, sites now called *Waverly*, adjacent the *Brick House*, and *Snow Creek*, respectively. He gave his daughter Mary (married Francis Thornton Jr of *Fall Hill*) a ring; he also named his daughter Elizabeth (married John Catlett II). He gave to his sons: Charles (married Ann Kemp) 300 acres at *Church Neck* and his Mount Creek lands; Robert (married Elizabeth Matthews) and Zachariah (unmarried) the 1350 acres at Golden Vale Swamp divided between them; Richard (married Rose Berryman) the *back half of land I live on* at Peumansend Creek; and William (married Mary (-) of King & Queen Co, VA?) *after my wife's decease, the other half river front with home.*

The survey of the land as divided by his will is extant; it is found among the Minor Papers at the Virginia Historical Society.¹² An apparently updated copy of this survey is found in the first Caroline County Survey Book (1730).¹³

After his mother's decease--apparently before 1730 when he was recorded owner in the Caroline Co, VA Survey Book, the *Brick House* and 300 acres went to youngest son Wm³ (c1710-w1760/KQ). William³ apparently sold the *Brick House* before 1735 when he was recorded as a vestryman at Stratton Major Parish in King & Queen Co, VA.

Wm's migration to K&Q may have been as a result of marriage to a Mary (-). Their son Philip--a name unique in this branch of Taliaferros--may have been named for Mary's father. This may also explain how the plantation *Hockley* in K&Q came into William's possession.¹⁵

In any event, the apparent buyer of the 'Brick House' was Wm⁴ (p1707-p1756/Caroline?), son of Lawrence³, for when William⁴ apparently failed in old age, his brother Francis⁴ (p1707-w1758/Spots)¹⁶ took possession by Spotsylvania Co, VA Court order (via a Jury Trial) before 1757 when he was declared William's *heir apparent*.¹⁷

When Francis⁴ died in 1758, he left his Caroline lands (including the *Brick House*) to his son Lawrence⁵ (1734-w1798/Orange). Lawrence advertised the sale of the 712 acres which belonged to his father, Francis⁴, and his grandfather, Lawrence³. It included the 300 acre site of the *Brick House* of his great-grandfather, John Taliaferro "The Ranger". The house described in the ad, however, was not the *Brick House* which by then was likely in disrepair and/or was partially dismantled. The home described in an August 15, 1766 advertisement in the *Virginia Gazette* is now called *Waverly*. John Taliaferro "The Ranger" deeded his son Lawrence this 300 acre parcel adjoining the *Brick House*¹⁸. Built 1715-1726, the home of Lawrence³ was modeled after the *Brick House* of his father, John Taliaferro:

To be sold to the highest bidder, on Monday the 10th of November next (if fair, otherwise next fair day) at the home of Capt. Fox, in Port Royal, A beautiful tract of Land situated on Rappahannock River, about half a mile below Port Royal, containing 700 acres, on which is located a very good brick house one story high, 4 rooms and 3 closets on the lower floor and 2 above, a good cellar under it, a portico [porch] 52 ft long and 8 wide facing the river, a 12 foot porch on the front side, good kitchen and laundry with brick chimney, garden 200 feet square poled in with sawed poles, poplar rails and cedar posts, a good strong barn 40 by 20 floored and ceiled [sic] with plank, with two 8 foot sheds, and all other convenient out-houses; also the best shad and

herring fishery on the river, with a good fish house on the shore; on the main road, about a half a mile from the dwelling house, is a blacksmith's shop and dwelling house, well situated for that business. The land is well known to be good for farming, as there is a great deal of good meadow ground, about 8 acres of which is fit for sowing grass this fall. There is also about 170 acres of said land uncleared, with very good timbers on it; also two young apple orchards, with about 700 choice grafted trees.

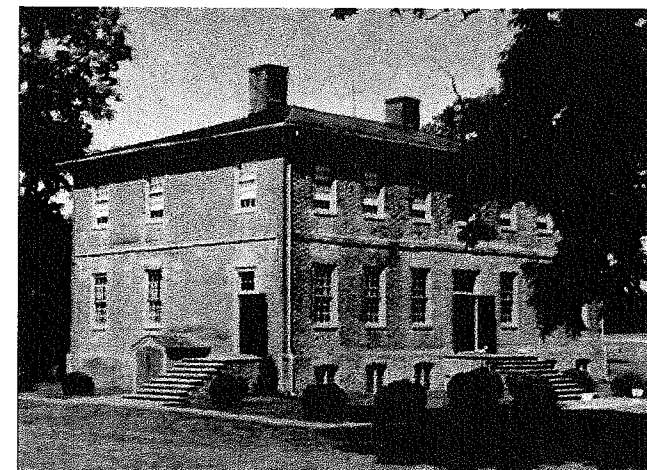
The Brick House excavation site has been covered for preservation purposes. There is a marker denoting the site of the *Brick House* at Cedar Creek Farm near Port Royal, VA--likely burial site of John Taliaferro 'The Ranger' and his wife, Sarah Smith, d/o Lawrence.

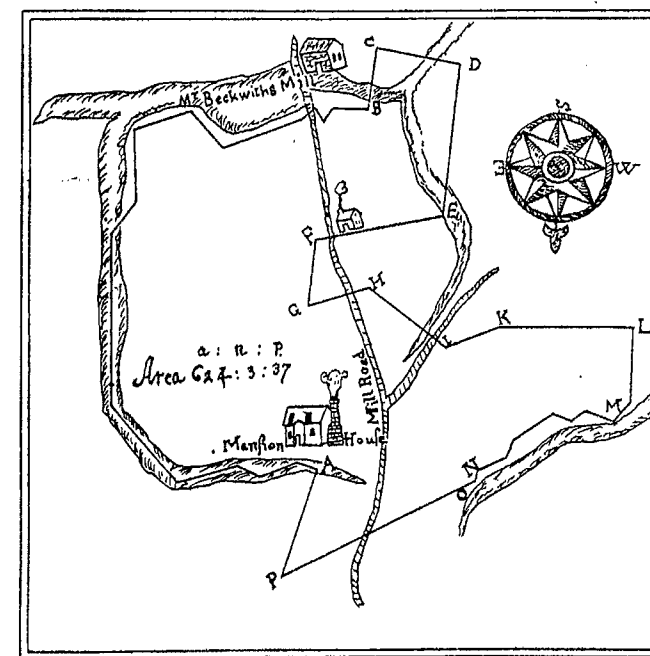

"Blenheim," Caroline County, Virginia (c1740s)

Built by Robert Taliaferro, son of John of "The Mount" (Fra-Robt), this was not the home of Capt. Richard Taliaferro (John-Robt) and his son Richard. Probably named for the victory by the Duke of Marlborough over the French and Bavarian armies in Blenheim, near Hockstat, on the River Danube, Germany, in 1704. (29. TQ(o): 240)

Union Army, American Civil War: Few Taliaferros died serving in the Union Army during the American Civil War-- probably because most Taliaferros fought for the South and not for the North as most Taliferros were from Virginia. The Roll of Honor Index by M&W.Reamy lists just two KIA: Talifero, Claiborne (23:14); Tallifaro, Hardin (22:104).

Confederate Army, American Civil War: Many Taliaferros served--and died--in the Confederate Army during the War: the list is long and scattered on pages 68, 69, 72 & 284 (depending on spelling) of Volume XV of Janet B.Hewett's epic series, The Roster of Confederate Soldiers (1861-65) (Wilmington NC: Broadfoot Publishing Company (1996).
