ORIGIN OF THE NAME TALIAFERRO,

ACCORDING TO FAMILY TRADITIONS

And Various Published Opinions

There are, today, many branches of the TALIAFERRO family, with many of these branches having their own thoughts on when and where the name originated. Many of these thoughts and beliefs have been in the family for so many years that they are now traditional.

Following are some of these traditional beliefs that this writer has heard, or read, during the many years of research:-

THE NORMAN KNIGHT, NAMED TAILLEFER, HERO OF THE BATTLE OF HASTINGS

"The army got into motion from the hills of Telham or Heathland, marching to attack the English on the opposite hills of Senlac. A Norman called Taillefer, 'who sang very well, and rode a horse which was fast,' came up to the Duke (William the Conqueror), 'My Lord,' said he, 'I have served you long, and you owe me for all my services; pay me today, and if it pleases, grant unto me, for recompense in full, to strike the first blow in the battle.' 'I grant it,' said the Duke. So Taillefer darted before him singing the deeds of Charlemagne, and of the vassals who fell at Roncesvalles. As he sang he played with his sword, throwing it into the air and catching it in his right hand, and the Normans followed, repeating the songs, and crying, GOD HELP." From "A Popular History of France," vol. 1, by M. Guizot.

"A general charge of the Norman foot opened the battle (Battle of Hastings). In front rode the minstrel Taillefer, tossing his sword in the air and catching it again while he chaunted the songs of Roland. He was the first of the host who struck a blow, and the first to fall." From The History of The English People, page 145, by John Richard Green.

"With the morning the Battle of Hastings opened, the battle that was to determine the fate of England. It was begun by a horseman riding out from the Norman lines and advancing alone toward the English Army, tossing up his sword and skillfully catching it as it fell, and singing, all the while, the

stirring battle-songs of Charlemagne and Roland. The English watched with astonishment this 'careless dexterity,' and if they did not contrast the vivacity and nimbleness of the Norman foe with their own heavy and clumsy manners, others at least have not failed to do so for them." "In the midst of the Duke's cohort was the sacred gonfanon, and in front of it and of the whole line, rode a strange warrior of gigantic height. As he rode, the warrior sang:-

'Chaunting loud the lusty strain
Of Roland and of Charlemagne,
And the dead, who deathless all,
Fell at Famous Roncesval,'

and the knights, no longer singing hymn and litany, swelled, hoarse through their helments, the martial chorus, This warrior, in front of the Duke and the horsemen, seemed beside himself with the joy of battle. As he rode, and as he chaunted, he threw up his sword in the air like a gleeman, catching it nimbly as it fell, and flourishing it wildly, till, as if unable to restrain his fierce exhilaration, he fairly put spurs to his horse and, dashing forward to the very front of a detachment of Saxon riders shouted 'A Taillefer, A Taillefer' and by voice and gesture challenged forth someone to single combat.

A fiery young thegn who knew the Romance tongue, started forth and crossed swords with the poet; but by what seemed rather a sleight of hand than a knight's fair fence, Taillefer, again throwing up and catching his sword with incredible rapidity, shore the unhappy Saxon from helm to the chine, and riding over the corpse, shouting and laughing, he again renewed his challenge. A second rode forth and shared the same fate. The rest of the English horsemen stared at each other aghast; the shouting, singing, juggling giant seemed to them not knight, but demon; and that single incident, preliminary to all other battle, in sight of the whole field, might have sufficed to damp the ardour of the English, had not Leofwine, who had been despatched by the King with message to the entrenchments, came in front of the detachment; and, his gay spirit roused and stung by the insolence of the Norman, and the evident dismay of the Saxon riders, without thought of his graver duties, he spurred his steed to the Norman giant; and not even drawing his sword, but with his spear raised over his head, and his form covered by his shield, he cried in the Romance tongue, "Go and chaunt to the foul fiend, O croaking minstrel." Taillefer rushed forward, his sword shivered on the Saxon shield, and in the same moment he fell a corpse under the hoofs of his steed, transfixed by the Saxon spear." THE COUNTS OF ANGOULEME and ISABELLE TAILLEFER

"Angouleme, a city of Southwest France, was taken, by Clovis, from the Visigoths in 507, and plundered by the Normans in the 9th century. In 1360 it was surrendered by the peace of Bretigny to the English; they were, however, expelled in 1373 by the troops of Charles V, who granted the town numerous privileges. It suffered much during the Wars of Religion, especially in 1568 after its capture by the Protestants under Coligny. The Counts of Angouleme date from the 9th century, the most important of the early Counts being WILLIAM TAILLEFER, whose descendants held the title until the end of the 12th century. Withdrawn from them on more than one occasion by Richard-de-Lion, it passed to King John, of England, on his marriage with Isabelle, daughter of Count Ademar, and by her subsequent marriage, in 1220, to Hugh X passed to the Lusignan, Counts of Marche." "The legend which accounts for the origin of the Taillefer name in France is given by the chronicler Amimer de Chabanois, who relates that in the 10th century, William, Count of Angouleme, (grandson of Vulgrin, the first Count and kinsman of Charles the Bald) assumed the name of Taillefer after having defeated Storis (Stonius), a King of the Northmen, in single combat, the reason for his doing so being that he had performed the great knightly achievement of hewing his adversary literally in twain, through breastplate and breastbone, with one single stroke of his good sharp sword". Taken from the book, "Borlace of Borlace," by William Copeland Borlase, 1888.

A brief sketch of the Counts of Angouleme follows:

1. Rogelinde of Poitiers, married Vulgrin I, died 886. The first hereditary Count of Angouleme. Reigned 866 - 886.
2. Andoinn 2nd Count of Angouleme. reigned 886 - 916
3. Guillaume I, 3rd Count of Angouleme, called Taillefer, Cleavor of Iron, because during battle "with a terrific blow of his sword, he cleaved into, from head to feet, the body and armor of Stonius, a Norman chief, thereby terminating the Norman invasions of this region." He transmitted the Taillefer name to all his posterity; died 975, reigned 916 - 975. (note: This is the same Count that is previously mentioned as William, Count of Angouleme.)

4. Amand Taillefer, 4th Count of Angouleme, married Hildegarde.
5. Guillaume Taillefer II, 5th Count of Angouleme, reigned 1001 - 1028, builder of the Cathedral of Angouleme; builder of the Palace that was later known as Maison Taillefer, where Queen Elizabeth, of England, was born. He married Gerberge d'Anjou, the daughter of Geoffrey Grisonelle, Count of Anjou.
6. No information, reigned 1028 - 1030.
7. Geoffrey Taillefer, 7th Count of Angouleme, reigned 1030 - 1048, married Petron d'Archiac. Died 1048.
8. Fulk Taillefer, 8th Count of Angouleme, reigned 1048 - 1108, married Coude, daughter of Ournorman Vageua.
9. Guillaume Taillefer III, 9th Count of Angouleme, reigned 1108 - 1120, went to the Holy Land with a company of knights, died on the returned trip. Married Corlieu de Vitapoi, daughter am Amanieu.
10. Vulgrin Taillefer II, 10th Count Angouleme, reigned 1120 - 1140, born 1099, died 1140.
11. Guillaume Taillefer IV, 11th Count of Angouleme, reigned 1140 - 1178. Died at Messina on his way to the Holy Land in 1178. Married 1136 to Emme de Limoges "after he kidnaped her from her affianced husband, William X, Duke of Auitaine. She was the daughter of Aymer IV, Vicomte of Limoges. They had three sons who were successively Counts of Angouleme.
12. Vulgrin Tallifer III, 12th Count of Angouleme, reign started 1178, abdicated 1179, died 1181. His only child, Mathilde Taillefer, died 1233, Countess of La Marche in her own right after her cousin, Adlebert de Montgomery V, Count of Le Marche died with out issue in 1180. She married Hugh de Lusignan. Count of La Marche. Mathilde betrothed her infant son, Hugh de Lusignan X, to her infant first cousin, Isabelle Taillefer, in the desire to bring together again the rich estates of the two branches of the Taillefer family. Thus, as was the custom, Isabelle was taken to the Lusignan castle so Mathilde might rear and educate her successor, and as a virtuous wife for her son. French records and history evidence that Mathilde's efforts were successful, for Isabelle was known in her native land to have been one of the most refined, pious and splendidly educated of the noble heiresses of that period.
13. Guillaume Taillefer V, 13th Count of Angouleme, reigned 1180 - 1185, died without issue in 1185; was succeeded by his younger brother.
14. Aymer Taillefer, 14th Count of Angouleme, reigned 1185 - 1217, died 1217 buried in Chapelle St. Nicholas La Couronne near

Angoulene, one of the churches built and endowed by his daughter, the Countess - Queen, as Isabelle chose to call herself after her 2nd marriage. Aymer Taillefer's only child and heiress was Isabelle Taillefer. Isabelle, as stated above, was betrothed, while still in infancy, to her infant cousin, Hugh de Lusignan (Hugh the X). Many things were destined to happen before this wedding was to take place. While Isabelle Taillefer did, eventually, marry Hugh X she was first to marry King John, of England. This information based on information in the book, "Magna Carta" by John S. Wurts

ISABELLE TAILLEFER and KING JOHN OF ENGLAND

King John. of England. (the brother of Richard Coeur de Lion) was the hated John of the Robin Hood legends, the John whom his rebellious Barons forced to sign the famous Magna Carta (The Great Charter) om June 15, 1215. King John, divorced from his first wife, attended the the announced wedding of Isabelle Taillefer and Hugh X at St. Cybarb Abbey, near Angouleme on August 26, 1200. King John was so taken with the beauty of the bride, to be, that he compelled the Bishop of Angouleme, Jean de St. Val, to celebrate his own marriage with Isabelle in the church where already people were assembled for the ceremony between Isabelle and Hugh. Then, after the marriaged had been preformed, King John took his stolen bride to Bordeaux, where his own Archbishop of Bordeaux solemnly declared that no impediment existed to the marriage, and again united their hands in marriage rites.

This threw Count Hugh X, the husband to be, into despair and he challenged to mortal combat the royal interloper. The wiley John answered to the effect that if Count Hugh wished for combat he would appoint a champion to fight with him. Unable to obtain satisfaction from King John, Hugh X, with Isabelle's father, Aymer Taillefer, appealed to King Philip of France for redress, while King John sailed with his unhappy bride for England.

When King John and his stolen bride arrived in England, he called a council of the Kingdom at Westminster, where Isabelle was introduced and acknowledge as Queen-Consort of England. There exists a charter in the Tower of London, stating that Isabelle Taillefer, of Angouleme, was crowned queen by the common consent of the Barons, Clergy, and people of England at Westminster, 8th October, 1200, by Hubert Walter, Archbishop of Canterbury.

Isabelle intrigued constantly and contrived to install her relatives in the marjority of the most lucrative posts in England. These relatives were probably members of the Lusignan and La Marche clans as well as the Taillefers.

When King John died in 1216, Isabelle, his widow, then returned to France and there she married Hugh X, whom she was pre-

paring to marry at the time she was stolen by King John. Many of the Taillefer relatives, who had followed her to England, remained and established families in England.

Isabelle Taillefer, of Angouleme, born August 26, 1186, at the Maison Taillefer at Angouleme, Charente, France, died 1246, buried at Fontevrault Abbey, Maine-et-Loire, where her remarkable tomb of sculpture and painted oak yet remains. This sculptured image is believed to be her best likeness as it was commissioned and placed in the Royal Chapel by her son, Henry III, King of England, at the side of his grandparents, King Henry II and Eleanor of Aquitaine, and near his uncle, Richard Coeur-de-Lion. The latter three effigies are of sculptured stone. The British Government at one time tried to get permission to remove all four to Wesrminster Abbey, but the French government refused the request. Based on information from the book, "The Pageantry of England," by Costain.

THE BARBARIAN and JULIUS CAESAR

About 58 B. C. Julius Caesar, while on a campaign in Northern Gaul, was making an inspection of his camp and became separated from his men. Before Caesar could find his way back to his men he became surrounded by a band of barbarians and while fighting for his life, showed such courage in the fight, of which he had not a chance to win, that the leader of the barbarians so admired the courage of Caesar that he stopped the fight and spared the life of Caesar.

Caesar then rewarded the barbarian, who had saved his life, by taking him into the Roman camp, which was an honor as the Romans did not permit outsiders to enter their camps. In time the barbarian was made the personal arms bearer for Caesar and was given the name Taillefer which, it is said, came from the Latin words "Tatum," meaning a dart, or spear, and "Ferre," meaning to bear. It is from this barbarian, known as "Taillefer, that the Italian family of Tagliaferro is supposed to have been derived. Taken from "an old family legend."

WORK DONE BY GEORGE WYTHE and THOMAS JEFFERSON

Mr. George Wythe, (a signer of the Declaration of Independence) married, as he 2nd wife, Elizabeth Taliaferro and became interested in the Taliaferro name. Mr. Wythe was a friend and associate of Mr. Bellini, an Italian, who was then the instructor of modern languages at William and Mary College. Mr. Bellini informed Mr. Wythe that the name of Taliaferro was purely Italian and designated not only the district in Italy from which it came but the very village. Mr. Wythe wrote his friend and former pupil, Mr. Thomas Jefferson, at that time representing our Country at the Court of France, and asked him to have inquiries

made concerning the origin of the Taliaferro name. Mr. Wythe's primary concern, it seems, was to secure a copper book plate of the Arms of Tagliaferr, as it was then, as now, spelled in Italy. Several letters passed between Mr. Jefferson and Mr. Wythe and at least part of these letters are now on file in the Congressional Library. Probable the most significant of all the letters involved is one from Mr. Jean Fabbroni to Mr. Jefferson, in answer to an inquiry that Mr. Jefferson had made. this letter, plus an enclosed document, a copy of which we was published in "The William and Mary Quarterly, Vol. IV, 2nd series, July 1924," written by Mr. William Buckner McGroarty, also a Taliaferro descendant, follows:

"Sir:

Before replying to your obliging letter I wish to put myself in a position to answer the question with which you have honored me. I have found two families of Tagliaferri, one living at Manadi and the other at Lozzole, in a part of Tuscany that is called Mugello, and both reconize the same place of origin which is believed to be a part of Tagliaferri Village, which bears their name. I have seen the two heads of these families. One is called Francesco di Tagliaferri; he is the one of Manadi; the other is older and is called Giovann Tagliaferri. They are honest country people, and the first appeared to be more at ease. They told me they have preserved the tradition that in the year of the memorable famine there was one of their family who went away from their house but they did not know where; there was a great famine in Tuscany in 1709, or in the past century. I asked them if it was at that time the emigration took place; they answered they did not know. They have in their homes their coat of arms and I send you a sketch of it. These good people would be happy to have some information about the family transplanted to America, which has had these inquiries made. If you have any that would satisfy them you would greatly oblige me. Monsieur Jean Fabbroni, Florence, 20 July, 1786

Enclosed Memorandum"

The House of Tagliaferri In Tuscany:

This family lives at Manadi in the Cardeto. Another family in Commune of Lozzole, Magistracy of the Palezzolo of Romange. Another, third family lives in the parish of Casaglia Magistracy of the suburb of San Lorenzo. At manadi there now live four brothers, sons of the late Guiseppi Tagliaferri. At Lozzolo lives Giovanni, son of the late Sambi, who has six daughters and an only son. All these families own and cultivate their own lands. By tradition they have it that they originated at Mugello, where there is a place called Tagliaferri, and it is not long since they sold their lands there. They say also from tradition that they have always heard it said that one of them went away to far countries; they do not know his name, but

believe it may be the one who left there on account of the great famine in the last century. The Tagliaferri family of Cardedo possesses a document from which it appears that at the end of the year 1599 Pietro Menghini of Tagliaferri founded a chapel in the parochial church of San Patrizio in Tirli, Florentine Diocese, Vicarage of Firenzuola."

In the article by Mr. McGroarty, he continued to say: "while Mr. Jefferson and Mr. Wythe accepted the theory of the Italian origin, and Mr. Wythe supposes the Italian emigrant to be the Lawrence Taliaferro (immigrant from Italy to Scotland) who came to Scotland in 1500, there is grounds for an even earlier origin; the generally accepted one of the Norman knight who came over with William the Conqueror in 1066."

TALIAFERRO PEDIGREE, As Mentioned By Mr. W. B. McGroarty

In the article by Mr. McGroarty, (as mentioned on page 7, end of first paragraph, of this works) he continued to say: --- "I have recently received from a correspondent a copy of a Taliaferro pedigree, based on the Italian origin, which, if the references are genuine, presents a strong argument for the Italian origin, and more especially as it includes the immigrant ROBERT TALIAFERRO; something no other genealogist has been able to do. A portion of the chart is given here, I know nothing of its origin."

1. Bartolomeo Taliaferro, a native of Venice, came to London in the Reign of Elizabeth. He was a member of the Band of Gentlemen Musicians to Elizabeth and resided in the parish of St. Olaves in Hart Street. He died in 1602, and his will is on file in the Prerogative Court of Canterbury (§29 Montague); had
2. Francois Taliaferro; (British Record, 2 Vol. 25, p. 407; probably born in Italy, married at St. Bolophis, Bishop's Gate, in 1586, he died 1610; had
3. Francis Taliaferro, born 1585; married, and had, with possible others
4. Robert Taliaferro, born 1635, came to Virginia 1655, settling in Gloucester County, where he married the Daughter of the Rev. Grymes."

Mr. McGroarty made the the following remarks of the pedigree: "An element of weakness in this pedigree is that Robert Taliaferro gave every sign of a longer English probation, if we may use the word, than is indicated; when he, Robert Taliaferro, came to Virginia he was neither a foreigner nor a Catholic; but, even so, he was fourth in descent from the Italian, Bartolomeo, (per the above pedigree) and the three generations may have done the work."

THE TALIAFERRO PEDIGREE, As Told By Sir Anthony Wagner and E. F. Andrus

THE VIRGINIA MAGAZINE of History and Biography, dated January, 1969, carried the following article:

"THE ORIGIN OF THE FAMILY OF TALIAFERRO, by Sir Anthony Wagner and E. F. Andrus."---

Speculation on the origin of Robert Talafer or Tolliver who settled in Virginia by 1747 has ranged from Scotland where the forms of Taillefer, Talfer, Telfer, and others found from the thirteen century onwards, through England where the forms include Tolver and Tullver, through France to Italy where Taliafera and Taliaferro are not uncommon. This meant that the surname itself, being so widespread was of little use as a clue, and it was, therefore with relief and gratitude for our good fortune that we found in the London area, the likeliest immediate place of origin for an early Virginia settler, references to members of a family of the name which appeared to fit the Virginia data perfectly.

From these, as will be seen, the conclusion has now been reached that Robert the settler was the grandson of Bartholomew Taliaferro, a subject of the Duke of Venice, who settled in London and was made denizen [an alien granted special rights of citizenship] in March 1562.

Important points in favor of the indentification were that this particular family of Taliaferro was the only one found in the probate records of the Prerogative Court of Canterbury and of London, and that after 1647 the name entirely disappeared from these probate records. Furthermore, letters of the administration of the estate of Francis Taliaferro were granted on the 20th of August 1647 to his daughter Anne, not to his son Robert, as we might have expected had he been in England at the time. Robert was then aged twenty years and nine months.

Finally, the emigrant called one of his sons Francis.

It now remains to see if light can be thrown on the Italian origin and ancestry of Bartholomew and to this end further research is now proceeding [1969].

1. Bartholomew Tallafer, Taliaferra, Taliaferro, etc. a subject of the Duke of Venice, paid 20 shillings for Letters of Denization in England March 4 1562. Lived in various Parishes in London until his death. Buried September 22, 1601 at St. Olave's Hart Street, London. Will dated September 18, 1601, proved May 8, 1602 P.C.C. (29 Montague). Married Joane Lane January 1, 1583/4, at St. Michael's, Cornhill, London. She subsequently married Thomas Graye of Whitechapel County Middlesex, widower, May 15, 1602, at St. Olave's, Hart Street. He was buried June 12, 1617, at Whitechapel, and his will was dated May 3, and proved July 17, 1617, P.C.C. (67 Weldon). Children:

children; [of Bartholomew and Joane Lane Taliaferro]

1. Katherine, baptized November 29, 1584, at St. Olave's, buried there January 12, 1584/85.

2. Horatio, baptized January 16, 1⁵85/86 at St. Olave's, buried there July 21, 1593.

* 3. Siprion or Ciprion (Scipio), of London, merchant. Baptized February 25, 1587/88 at St. Olave's. Mentioned in his father's will. Buried September 7, 1609, at St. Bishopsgate, London. Will dated September 6, proved October 27, 1609 (Commissary Court of London).

* 4. FRANCIS, of Bethnal green Stepney County Middlesex, baptized January 25, 1590/90 at St. Olave's. [see below for details]

5. Izack (twin) baptized March 18, 1592/93, at St. Olave's, mentioned in the wills of his father and brother Ciprion. Buried August 2, 1610 At St. Botolph's Bishopsgate.

6. Jacob (twin) baptized March 18, 1592/93, at St. Olave's. Buried there August 2, 1593.

* 7. Elyzabeth, baptized January 26, 1594/95, at St. Olave's. Married February 27, 1611/12, at St. Botolph's, Bishopsgate's, by license of the Bishop of London, her stepbrother William Graye, who was mentioned as deceased in his father's will in 1617. Mentioned in the wills of her father, brother Ciprion, and father-in-law (who was also her stepfather) Thomas Graye.

8. Bartholomew, baptized December 9, buried December 10, 1596, at St. Olave's.

9. Jeromme, mentioned in the will of his father and (as Jeremy) in that of his brother Ciprion. Buried September 7, 1609, at St. Botolph's Bishopsgate, age 11.

2. FRANCIS Talyfer or Talafero (son of Bartholomew) of Bethnal Green in Stepney, County Middlesex, yeoman. Baptized January 25, 1589/90, at St. Olave's. Mentioned in the wills of his father, stepfather, and brother Ciprion. Buried August 19, 1647, at Stepney. Administration following day (Commissary Court of London). Married, first, Bennett Hale, by licene February 3, 1613/14, at St. Saviour's, Southwark, County Surrey. She was living November 1626. Married, second. Mariam, who was buried August 16, 1647, at Stepney from Bethnal Green. Children, by first wife:

1. Anne, administratrix of her father's estate 1647.

2. ROBERT, baptized November 19, 1626, at Stepney age 8 days.

3. Robert Talafer, Tolliver, etc., (son of Francis, grandson of Bartholomew), baptized November 19, 1626, at Stepney, aged 8 days. Witnessed the will of Robert Meeke of York County, Virginia, November 1, 1647. Was granted 800 acres (with Samuel Salate or Sallis) February 12, 1651, in Gloucester County and 6300 acres (with Lawrence Smith) March 26, 1666, in Rappahannock (later Caroline and Spotsylvania County, Virginia).

Children, among others

B 1654 D 1710
1. Francis, of Gloucester County, Virginia, Gentleman, Made grants to his brothers September 28, 1682, from the lands granted to their father, jointly with Lawrence.

2. John, land granted to him by his brother, Francis, September 28, 1682, then about to marry Sarah, daughter of Lawrence Smith.

3. Richard,

4. Charles, land granted to them [Richard and Charles] jointly by their brother Francis September 28, 1682, both being then minors.

End of quote from the article in The Virginia Magazine, by Sir Anthony Wagner and F. S. Andrus. It should be noted that Sir Anthony, K. C. V. O., IS Garter King of Arms and Mr. Andrus is one of his assistants.

The reader should note the similarity of the two Taliaferro pedigrees just mentioned. There is little left to doubt that they are the same; the one presented by Mr. McGroarty, in 1924, which is 45 years before the one published by Sir Anthony Wagner and F. S. Andrus, is not as clear and detailed, nor is the writer known. This writer thinks had Mr. W. B. McGroarty lived to read the pedigree by Wagner and Andrus he would have accepted it as true.

All the known sources of the origin of the Taliaferro name have been examined and it shall be up to the reader to make his, or her, final judgement of the origin. Be that as it may, ROBERT TALIAFERRO, IMMIGRANT, was the first of the name to reach America!

Chapter 2

ROBERT¹ TALIAFERRO, IMMIGRANT

[Son of Francis and Bennett Hale Taliaferro]
[Grandson of Bartholomew and Joane Lane Taliaferro]

Robert¹ Taliaferro, Immigrant and Gentleman, born November 11, 1626, in England, died August 8, 1687. The only one of the name to migrate to America during the Colonial days. Just when he arrived in America is not known. His name first appears on record November 1, 1647, as a witness to the will of one Robert Weeks in York County, Virginia.

In 1651 Robert¹ Taliaferro, with Samuel Sollis, patented 1800 acres of land in Gloucester County, Virginia. On March 6, 1666 Robert¹ Taliaferro and Lawrence Smith patented 6,300 acres "in the freshes of the Rappahannock," in 1671 they patented 4,972 acres. These last two tracts of land, totaling 11,272 acres joined each other

"Major Lawrence Smith was a famous man in the Colony; he commanded the fort established at the mouth of Massaponex on the land covered by the patent of 1,666 acres; this fort, in 1679, was rebuilt and strengthened, and Major Smith, for setting fifty armed men about it, and 250 others within call, was granted a tract of land extending along the river for three miles above the fort and two and one half miles below it, and extending back into the country four miles. Major Smith's half of the 1,666 acres was included in the stretch of two and one half miles below, and three miles above the fort carrying his line well up towards the present Fredericksburg, where it apparently joined the Buckner-Royston patent; it included the afterwards well known seats of "Epsom," "Smithfield" and "Newpost." [Per writings of William Buckner McGroarty]

This property of Major Lawrence Smith comes into importance to the Taliaferro family as John² Taliaferro [son of Robert¹ Taliaferro] later married Sarah Smith [daughter of Major Lawrence Smith] and this marriage combined a large part of these lands.

In the early Colonial Virginia days, the London Company assigned 50 acres to any person that paid his own way, or if he "paid at his own cost" the transportation of others to Virginia. This right was known as "headrights." The tract of 6,300 acres that Robert¹ Taliaferro and Major Lawrence Smith patently jointly, was in payment for 126 "headrights," or to be more specific, for the transportation of 126 persons from England to

to Virginia. [A full list of the 126 persons brought to Virginia under these "headrights" can be found in the book, "Cavaliers and Pioneers," by N. M. Nugent.] The very fact that Robert¹ Taliaferro and Major Lawrence Smith were able to bring to Virginia this many people is indication, beyond a doubt, that they were both of considerable means.

Very little is known of the life of Robert¹ Taliaferro and the small amount that is known is taken from scattered land records. One very important item concerning the history of Robert¹ Taliaferro is the correct name of his wife. The correct name of the wife is disputed among historians and genealogists. The dispute is, not who the wife was, but her exact name. In all source documents, relating to the early family, the name is shown as being "Sarah Grymes, daughter of Rev. Charles Grymes."

In the "Virginia Magazine," Vol. 56, pages 208-210, in an article by by Mr. John Bailey Calvert Nicklin, appears a version of the correct name of Robert¹ Taliaferro. Mr. Nicklin quotes several legal documents, and he ends with the expressed opinion that the wife of Robert¹ Taliaferro was Katherine Dedman, daughter of Katherine and Henry Dedman; that the widow of Henry Dedman later married Rev. Charles Grymes; thereby making Katherine Dedman [daughter of Katherine and Henry Dedman] the step-daughter of Rev. Charles Grymes.

In "Tyler's Quarterly," Vol. 18, page 165, in an article by W. B. McGroarty, he says: "Text of a record in the Virginia Land Office at Richmond, page 445, Vol. of Land Grants 1666-1679; a grant from Sir William Berkeley to Robert Taliaferro, son of Robert Taliaferro, 739 acres in the freshes, Rappahannock County, south side adjoining Henry Corbin and Mr. Grymes, 17 March 1672/3, 100 acres being his due as grandchild of ye sd. Grymes, and 639 acres for the transportation of 14 persons."

From the last we must note that the Robert Taliaferro mentioned is Robert² Taliaferro and he is mentioned as the grandson of Rev. Charles Grymes; it is of important to note that the reference to "grandson" was made in the year 1672/3; that the reference to Katherine Dedman, grandmother of Robert Taliaferro" was not made until 1718, some 45 years after the reference of "grandson of Rev. Charles Grymes" was made.

It is believed, by this writer, that the correct name of the wife of Robert¹ Taliaferro is Sarah Grymes, the daughter of Rev. Charles Grymes and his wife, Katherine Dedman.

Rev. Charles Grymes, born circa 1612; died circa 1662, born in Igtham, Kent, England, and died in Virginia; matriculated at Cambridge at the age 18; rector of Hampton Parish in York County, Virginia in 1645.

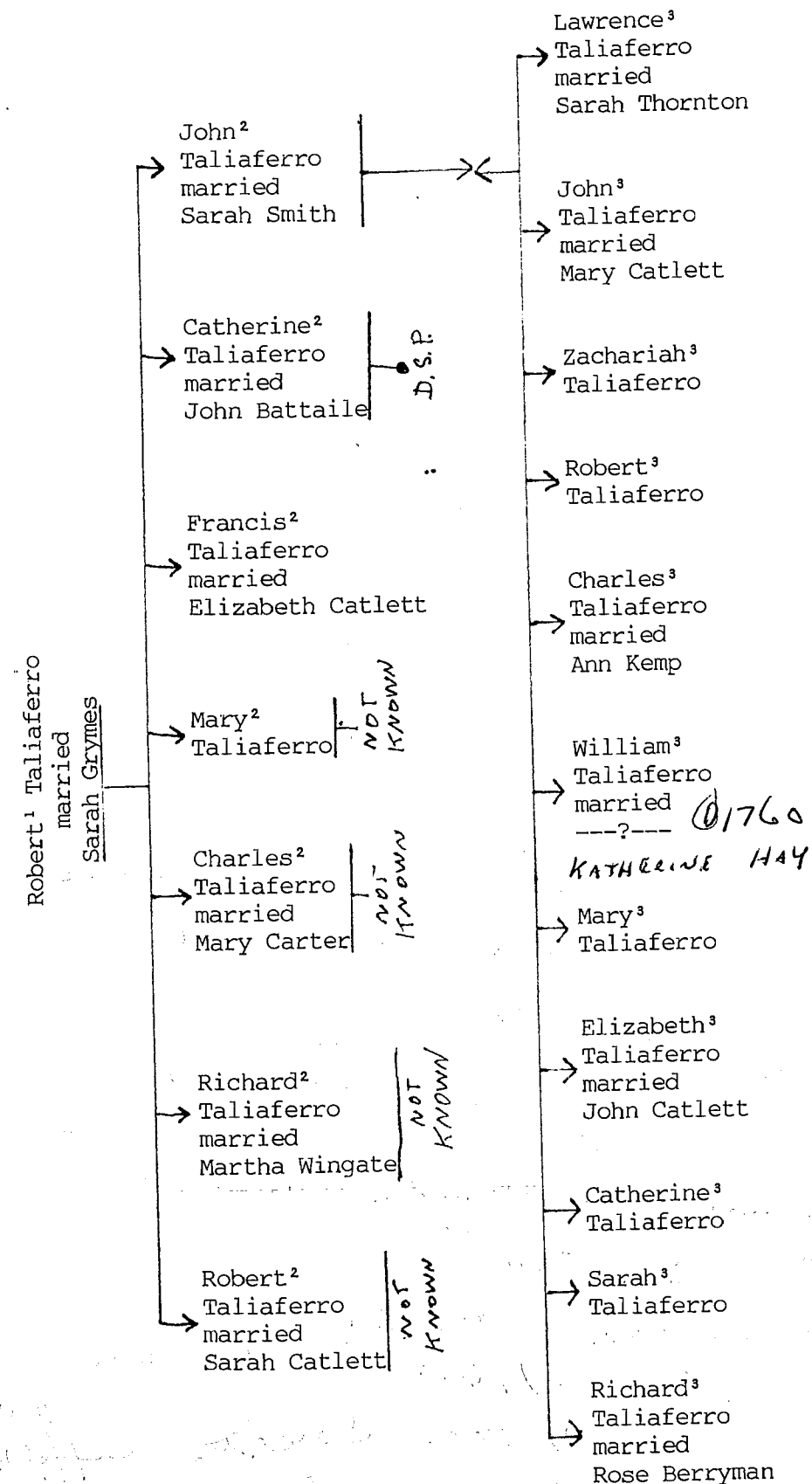

An Appreciation

by Eugene McAuliffe

There passed away at 6:10 A. M., on Sunday, August 17th, in his home in Rock Springs, Wyoming, a man, Mr. Thomas Seddon Taliaferro, Jr., whom thousands throughout the Rocky Mountain region of the west, and in the State of Virginia, lovingly spoken of as the "Old Dominion," and the "Mother of Presidents," felt honored to know as a warm friend, a brilliant constitutional lawyer and a gracious gentleman.

It was the writer's privilege to know Mr. Taliaferro intimately for more than 17 years, during which time, in season and out, myself and my family were the recipients of an hospitality that was so warm, and so friendly, as to leave a continuing series of happy imprints on our memory. In this privilege we were in no sense alone, for Mr. Taliaferro's home and the generous hospitality of Mr. and Mrs Taliaferro was extended to thousands, over the forty-four years of their married life. The sadness of parting with this dear friend was for us softened by the memory of a most happy hour spent with him and Mrs. Taliaferro, but thirty-six hours before death's called him as he slept. Mr. Taliaferro could not be other than as he was. Born in Gloucester County, Virginia, July 1, 1864, less than three months after the surrender at Appomattox, his family suffering heavily from the Civil War, in which they were active participants, the boy grew up in an atmosphere of tense uncertainty, made livable only by the memory of a rich heritage of blood and tradition coming down from the earliest permanent English settlement on American soil.

The son of Major Thomas Seddon Taliaferro and Harriotte (Lee) Taliaferro, the latter a daughter of Cassius F. Lee, a leading Virginia layman of the Episcopal Church in Virginia, a granddaughter of Edmund Jennings Lee and a great-granddaughter of Richard Henry Lee of Revolutionary fame, Mr. Taliaferro as we have said "could not be other than as he was." On the paternal side Mr. Taliaferro came down from another Virginia line, including the Taliaferros, Seddons, Washingtons, Pages, among the most distinguished families of the "Old Dominion." Mr. Taliaferro's father served as a member of General Robert E. Lee's personal staff in the Army of Virginia, and his uncle, General William B. Taliaferro, commanded a division in the same army, with other members of the family serving the Southern cause.

Coming from a line of ancestry unexcelled in America, Mr. Taliaferro possessed a measure of self-respect, coupled with a passion for useful achievement, that few excel, regardless of family heritage or background. With the Virginia planters impoverished by the Civil War, Mr. Taliaferro's educational opportunities were restricted to an Episcopal High School in Alexandria, Virginia, and Gloucester Academy in his native county, which was located across the York river on whose banks was fought the last battle of the Revolutionary War, the battle of Yorktown, Virginia, where on October 18, 1781, Lord Cornwallis surrendered to Generals Washington and Rochambeau, commanding the the allied American and French forces. Impelled by that resistless energy that dominated his life, he left his family and storied birthplace behind him, and on November 2, 1883, when but eighteen years of age he entered the service of the Union Pacific Railroad at Green River, Wyoming, as a day laborer. Advancing step by step he reached what to him was the enviable position of Station Agent at Green River in 1888. Then

came the crowning event in our friend's career, his marriage on April 15, 1896, in Christ Church at Alexandria, Virginia, to his youthful sweetheart, Miss Lucy Ramsay, great-great-granddaughter of William Ramsay, first Mayor of Alexandria, great granddaughter of Colonel Dennis Ramsay, who served in the Revolutionary War in the battles of Princeton and Yorktown under General Washington and the granddaughter of George Washington Ramsay; her father, Mr. George William Ramsay, all of Alexandria, Virginia.

Mr. Taliaferro was a Past Master of the Masonic Lodge at Green River, the organizer of the lodge of Royal Arch Masons, Past Commander of Acalon Commandery of Knights Templar, a thirty-third degree Scottish Rite Mason, and at his death was said to be the oldest member of the Wyoming Masonic fraternity in point of service. His business activities outside of the practice of law in State and National courts, included the presidency of the First National Bank of Green River, a nominal connection with the State Bank of Green River and the Presidency of The Green River Mercantile Company. He stood in point of sheep ownership among the great flockmasters of his state and he also administered an extensive merchandising business and two ranches, the one located in Eden Valley north of Rock Springs his particular pride and interest.

Serving as legal representative for the Union Pacific Railroad and its related Coal and Utilities Companies, his practice also embraced the work of the several commercial coal mining companies in Southern Wyoming, the Rock Springs Grazing Association and the handling of numerous estates, with a wide general practice in which he was assisted in recent years by his son Arthur Lee Taliaferro. Strong in his beliefs, including an allegiance to the political party into which he was born, he was a dominant character, blazing his own trail in every circumstance, deciding in his own mind where was the "true north." Back of this strength he was a kindly, considerate, Christian gentleman, who never allowed himself to forget the traditions of the "Old Dominion" in which he was born.

Mr. Taliaferro is survived by his wife, Lucy Ramsay Taliaferro, who has served as National Democratic committeewoman for Wyoming for many years; five sons, William Ramsay Taliaferro of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; Thomas Seddon Taliaferro, 3rd, Arthur Lee Taliaferro, junior partner of his father's law firm, all of Rock Springs; Beverly Wellford Taliaferro and Edward Ludwell Taliaferro, of Green River, Wyoming; and two daughters, Mrs. Lucy Ramsay Englund of Denver, Colorado, and Harriotte Lee Taliaferro of Rock Springs, together with six grandchildren.

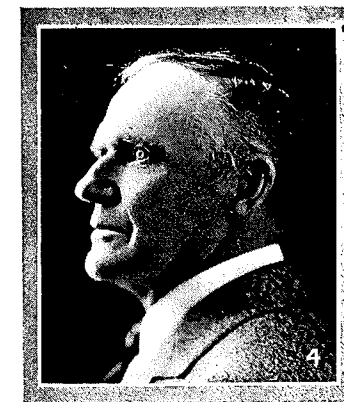
On Tuesday afternoon, August 20th, with a soft sun shining and with a complete absence of the two elements, wind and dust, that too often mark Wyoming's weather, the age-old burial service of the Episcopal Church, which our friend had cherished

and substained, was read over the remains in The Union Pacific Coal Company's spacious Old Timers' Building, of which organization he was a life member, the little church of which he was a member too small to hold his mourning friends. The remains were guarded by a detail of his old neighbors and friends in full Knights Templar uniform, the officiating clergyman The Reverend Alfred Lee Jones of Green River. From the Old Timers Building, where several hundreds of his friends met to say a final farewell, the remains were conveyed to Mountain View Cemetery, where the final commitment services were conducted by Mt. Moriah Lodge, No. 6, A.F. & A.M. of Green River, of which lodge Mr. Taliaferro was a member.

The Mayor of Rock Springs on the morning of the day on which the obsequies were held, issued a proclamation closing all business houses during the funeral hour, and the business places in Green River were similarly closed.

To thousands throughout the nation and the west, and in the country along the York and James rivers where Mr. Taliaferro's forebears lived since 1640, the news of his passing came as a distinct shock, for regardless of his years (more than three-quarters of a century), his pace and capacity for work had not been seriously slackened, and to the many recipients of the splendid Virginia hospitality shown by Mr. Taliaferro and his gracious wife, a feeling of more than sadness came. Every gathering where our friend sat was made significant by discussions of current affairs as well as world events. Few men had the intimate knowledge of early British and American history possessed by him, his reading embracing every branch of English literature.

And so we say Farewell to a courageous soul, a fine gentleman and a loyal friend.

Richard³ Taliaferro, the son of John² Taliaferro and his wife Sarah Smith, grandson of Robert¹ Taliaferro and his wife Sarah Grymes, was born in 1703, died Sept. 27, 1748. He was a large landholder and patented over 10,000 acres in what is now Amherst and Nelson Counties, Virginia. Married June 10, 1726, Miss Rose Berryman.

Rose Berryman was one of twenty-two children, seventeen lived to reach the age of maturity, of Benjamin Berryman and his wife Elizabeth Newton.

Benjamin Berryman was the only child of John Berryman who was the first of the name in America having arrived and settled in Westmoreland County, Virginia, in 1654. He was from England.

Elizabeth Newton was the daughter of John Newton and his 2nd wife Mrs. Rose Tucker Gerrard. Her maiden is not known.
