For each Hoghead of *Crop Tobacco* there is to be paid three Shillings, and for every Hoghead of *Transfer* five Shillings, and sixpence, under the *Tax* *Law*. Besides this there was an additional Duty of one Shilling and sixpence a Hoghead continued to the 25th of *October* last, and from that *Time*, under the *new and improved Duty* equal, the Inspectors are to receive an additional Duty of three Shillings for each Hoghead of *Crop* and *Transfer* till the 25th of *October* 1775; the Whole to be paid before the Delivery of the *Tobacco*, and the Accounts to be settled on or before the 10th of *November*, in each Year. It is hoped that this will be attended to without further Notice, and that the strict Punctuality will be observed in these and all other Transactions with the Treasury.
